Submission: The New Zealand Sport Fishing Council supports the proposed Mātaitai reserve at Tautuku, Southland.

Recommendations

1. The Minister approves the application from Te Rūnanga o Awarua for the proposed Mātaitai reserve from the lower reaches of the Tautuku River extending upstream to the Chaslands Highway, and the Fleming river between its confluence with the Tautuku River and upstream to the Chaslands Highway.

- 2. The New Zealand Sport Fishing Council (NZSFC) appreciates the opportunity to submit on the proposed Tautuku Mātaitai reserve.
