Review of rock lobster sustainability measures for 2021

The National Rock Lobster Management Group (NRLMG) and Fisheries New Zealand are seeking feedback from tangata whenua, stakeholders, and the public on proposed changes to catch limits for selected rock lobster stocks for 2021.

Sustainability measures and other management controls for rock lobster are reviewed annually by the NRLMG and Fisheries New Zealand to ensure the sustainable use of these stocks. Each stock is assessed using the best available scientific information.

There are proposed changes for four red rock lobster stocks (CRA 1, 3, 4 & 5) and packhorse rock lobster (PHC 1) for the April 2021 fishing year.

All four red rock lobster stocks are currently above target levels, but the best available information projects that the CRA 3, CRA 4 & CRA 5 stocks will decline over the next four years under the current catch settings, while the CRA 1 stock will increase slightly. Moderate decreases to catch settings are proposed to ensure these stocks remain at or above targets.

Packhorse rock lobster is a developing stock. The latest information suggests the stock has increased in abundance in recent years and is predicted to stay at the current level under the current catch settings. A total catch limit and allowances are proposed to be set for this stock for the first time, and a small increase to the commercial catch limit is being considered.
