





Secondary Proposals

Proposal B

Should a subset of finfish species commonly taken as bait (baitfish**) be excluded from the finfish combined daily bag limits and included within their own combined daily bag limit of 50?

Exclude baitfish species from the combined daily bag limits and set a separate combined daily bag limit of 50 for these excluded species

Additional Matter

Southern bluefin tuna

An administrative change is also proposed to move the southern bluefin tuna daily bag limit, currently set by Gazette Notice, to regulation so that offences and penalties align with other finfish daily bag limits.

This change will <u>not</u> affect the existing daily bag limit of one southern bluefin tuna per person, per day.
