Introduction

We've officially wrapped up our 2025 Southern Bluefin Tuna Pre-Season Seminar Series, delivered in partnership with Coastguard. What began as a casual chat between the Coastguard crew and the NZSFC team quickly evolved into a nationwide road trip with eight successful events, reaching over 500 safety conscious anglers ahead of the SBT 2025 season.

This work was driven by the emergence of this popular winter fishery and the tragic loss of too many mates on the water over recent years. With each seminar, we learned more, tweaked our presentation and shared the tips our local legends provided. It is becoming clear that a safety culture is emerging strongly within our fishing clubs and communities as no Fish is worth a life.

None of this would have been possible without the incredible support and volunteer effort from numerous clubs who stepped up and worked tirelessly behind the scenes. Achieved on a shoestring budget, the impact has been huge. We're thrilled to already have clubs and community groups lining up to host next year's events. Our next challenge is securing sponsorship to ensure we can continue and expand this vital work in 2026.

Deadlines

- End of year certificates and 5 to 1 certificates all need to be sent to secretary@nzsportfishing.org.nz by the 21st of July 2025. This date has been changed to allow clubs a bit more time to get the admin side of the process organised.
- Annual Trophy Nominations. The deadline for these is also the 21st of July 2025. We are looking for lots of
 nominations so please get to work on these. This time has also been extended to allow time to get the nominations
 completed.
- **Notices of Motion for the AGM.** The last day for accepting these is the 25th of July 2025. If you have an item you wish to be a notice of motion at our AGM please make sure I have it prior to this date.
- It is now time to get your nominations in for your zone delegates. If you need any voting papers please contact me.
- AGM registrations are out please send these back as soon as possible.
- Yearbook end of year. Please get the information about your club and catch records to me as soon as possible.
- **Junior World records** are now being recognised by IGFA. Please let your membership know about this as it is the best time to get in and get a world record.

Fishing Standing Committee (FSC)

• As the stunning winter bluefin fishery approaches fast the NZSFC has been working with the Coastguard to develop bluefin seminars that cover both the technical fishing aspects of bluefin fishing and the safety side.

Bluefin fishing, while spectacular, can be extremely dangerous, safety is paramount and we need to make sure that all our members are well informed and have safety in mind.

Some of our clubs are initiating minimum safety requirements for club members, like ensuring they have EPIRBS or PLB;s on board before heading outside VHF coverage areas chasing bluefin, while this is not a one size fits all approach, it is a simple sensible way to make sure that if things get bad you have a reliable means of communication that will give you a fighting chance when fishing out wide.

Best of luck and keep warm out on the water chasing those bluefin.

• Rules for both the Nationals and Youth Nationals are being worked on at the moment. Keep an eye out on the website and the new yearbook so you are all up to date when the Nationals begin.


Delegate Spotlights

Fisheries Management Standing Committee (FMSC)

- **Blue cod** The NZSFC has again asked Fisheries NZ to review Blue Cod 3 (East coast, South Island), Blue cod 5 (Southland), and Blue cod 8 (Taranaki, west coast of Wellington) by 1 October 2025. FNZ will consult with the Minister and advise their final list of fish stocks to be reviewed in October, in due course. NZSFC will engage with Clubs within the areas and stocks up for review.
- **Bottom trawling restrictions** On 12 May, the Minister confirmed that the <u>proposed trawl corridors</u> within the Hauraki Gulf Marine Park will not proceed. No formal statement has been issued. The <u>NZSFC submission</u> sent in November 2023 opposed the trawl corridors and urged Fisheries NZ to support a complete ban of bottom trawling and Danish seining in the Hauraki Gulf.
- Waikato Regional Council Coastal Plan Since 2022 NZSFC has been involved in the Waikato Regional Council Coastal Plan. Involvement has included attending hearings and providing detailed submissions. Thank you to nominated Club representatives from NZSFC including Dirk Sieling, Gordon McIvor, Bob Gutsell and Deryk Nielsen for attending the hearing and providing statements of evidence on 30 April 2025.
- Napier Reef temporary closure NZSFC is working alongside LegaSea Hawkes Bay and Zone 5 to draft a submission in support of the proposed temporary closure to the harvest of all marine species at an artificial reef off Napier Port. The submission will be finalised and sent on 18 June 2025.
- Kaikōura pāua season opening The Kaikōura pāua fishery opened to recreational harvest on 1 May, for 4
 months. The season runs until 31 August 2025. The new size limit for recreational harvest of pāua is 130mm
 or bigger.
